TINA Business Modelling

Stakeholder

 A party that holds a business interest or concern in the telecommunications business. A stakeholder owns one or more business administrative domains

· Business administrative domain

 defined by the requirements of one or more business roles and is governed by a single business objective

• Business role

 The expected function performed by a stakeholder in a telecommunications business environment



TINA Business Modelling

· Business relationship


- An association between two business roles


Reference point


 The manifestation of a business relationship in the telecommunication system. The reference point consists of several viewpoint related specifications governed by a contract

Contract

 A contract is the context defining constrains for one or more reference points to operate under


